WHAT DID YOU HEAR?

What did God say to you as you read today’s Bible passage?

This is where you turn your thought into prayer. It could be a prayer of gratitude or praise. It could be a prayer of confession or a request for God’s help. It’s up to you. But take a minute to write a prayer of response to God.

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Day 40

Without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

HEBREWS 11:6 (NIV*)

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Did you know God has many names? God reveals himself to us through a number of names that highlight specific aspects of his character. And each name is a promise to you. In this part of the prayer journey, we will learn these names one by one. More importantly, by praying the name of God, we desire to experience God's power and blessings.

Name of God: Abba

Translation: Father/ Daddy

References: Reflects warm affection and intimacy with one's father. Paul uses it to emphasise our intimate connection with God through Jesus: "God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba, Father!'" (Galatians 4:6 HCSB).

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Name of God: El Deah

Translation: God of Knowledge

References: Reflects God's omniscience. He is all-knowing and not surprised by anything. He sees the beginning, the middle, and the end. "Do not keep talking so proudly or let your mouth speak such arrogance, for the Lord is a God who knows, and by him deeds are weighed." (1 Samuel 2:3 NIV).

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
