References: A promise that God will supply our every need. When Abraham was about to sacrifice Isaac, God provided a ram: Abraham looked up and saw a ram caught in the thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering in place of his son. " So Abraham called that place The Lord Will Provide. And to this day it is said, 'On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided.'" (Genesis 22:14 NIV)

Genesis 28:15 (NIV) says, "I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go..." Deuteronomy 31:6 (NIV) says, "for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."
