



CHURCH RISK ASSESSMENT

The assessor can assign values for the 'hazard severity' and 'likelihood of occurrence' on scales of 1 - 5 to aid with rating risks:

Hazard Severity (a)	Likelihood of Occurrence (b)
 1 – Trivial (e.g. discomfort, scratch, slight bruising) 2 – Minor (e.g. small cut, abrasion, basic first aid need) 3 – Moderate (e.g. strain, sprain, incapacitation > 3days) 4 – Serious (e.g. fracture, hospitalisation > 24 hrs, some loss, moderately affect name & reputation of the church) 5 – Fatal (death, severe loss, definitely affect name & reputation of the church) 	 1 – Remote (almost never) 2 – Unlikely (occurs rarely) 3 – Possible (could occur, but uncommon) 4 – Likely (recurrent, but not frequent) 5 – Very likely (occurs frequently)

The Risk Matrix showing risk rating (high, medium or low) indicates the response to be taken for the assessed risks.

Risk assessment of: re-opening of Colindale/URC for Sunday services and associated activities

Overview of activity / location / equipment / conditions being assessed:

Phased re-opening of Colindale/URC for Sunday services after easing of lockdown upon COVID-19 pandemic. This risk assessment categorises visitors and covers how they travel to, enter and leave the perspective front and back hall of URC to be used for Sunday service. Flow of movement for visitors inside the church building: from the entrance to the worship space and out again, within the worship space, also access to other areas such as toilets are covered.

Context of the assessment:

Church buildings are legally permitted to reopen for public worship, with measures in place to comply with COVID-19 safety. The **government guidance for the safe use of places of worship during pandemic** requires to carry out a <u>COVID-19 risk assessment</u> (this document) in order to determine whether by introducing the respective control measures can reduce the risks that may meet the COVID-19 safety requirements. <u>Guidance on the safe use of church building</u> has been written up following the risk assessment to describe the control measures and arrangements. <u>Signages</u> will be displayed in the church building to illustrate some of the guidance and flow of movement. <u>a crowd control and track and trace system</u> will be setup. The role of the site manager of each Sunday service is to ensure COVID-19 safety is complied. A <u>checklist</u> will be developed to guide inspection and for record purpose.

Currently, church building allows gathering pending the venue is considered COVID-safe by putting together arrangements and practices based on the knowledge of this pandemic and the general hygiene practices to combat COVID-19 including asymptomatic manifestation, aerosol transmission, the 2m apart rule, avoid personal and surface contacts and a 14days period of quarantine. Priorities go to ensure safety of staff, serving members and visitors, and to prevent the church building becoming a COVID-19 hotspot/ source of spreading.
