Lastly we enter the **Advent** period which reminds us that the foundation of our church is built on Christ our Rock, and look forward to another year ahead.

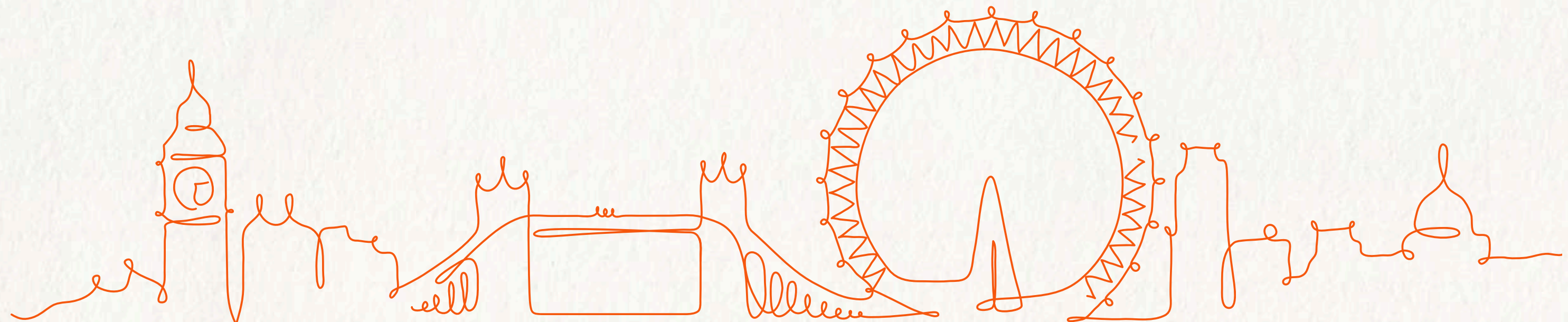
1. Renewing the Vision | Reigniting the Mission

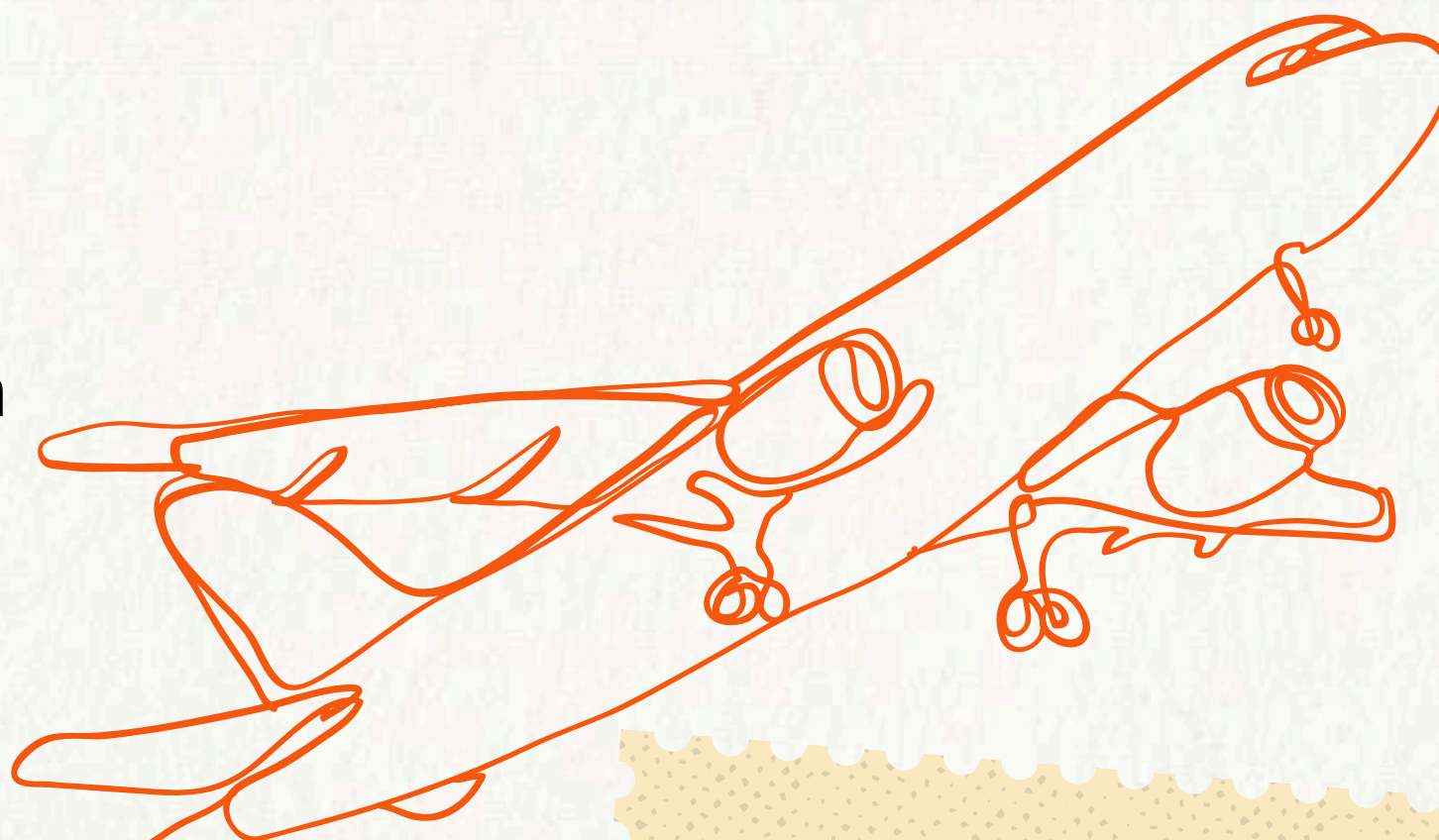


When brothers and sisters leave us,

Joel: From Repentance to Revival

Revival starts with Repentance.

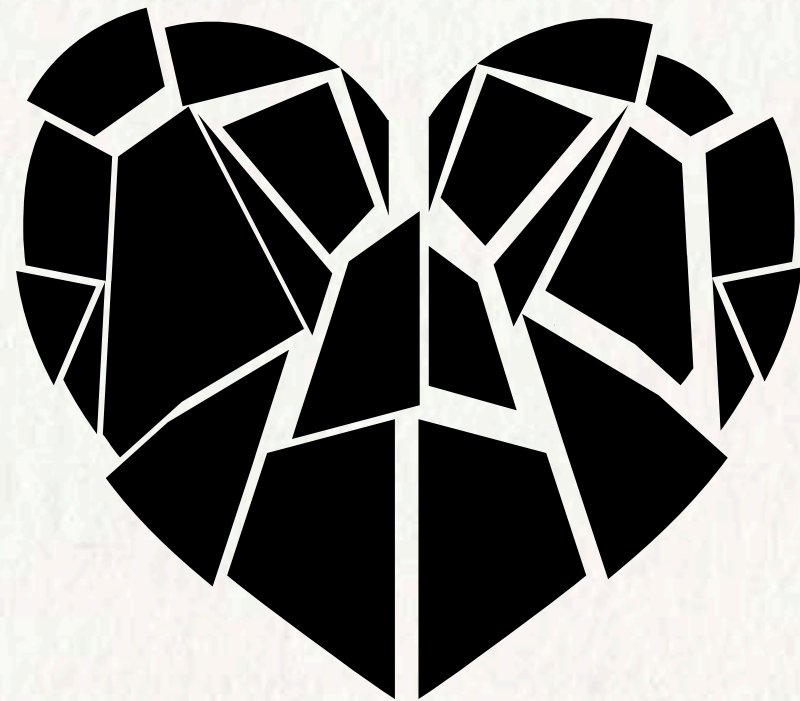
The book of Joel begins with the Lord's judgement on Judah and Jerusalem, which comes in the terrifying form of a locust infestation, drought and the coming of a great army. Then came the “day of the Lord” when God’s people are called to seek and return to Him so that this calamity and crisis will be averted.



Will God's people repent and return to him?

Will they move from inevitable destruction to restoration to dwell with him?

If his people do return he will turn their loss into blessing and restore what their sin has ultimately destroyed.

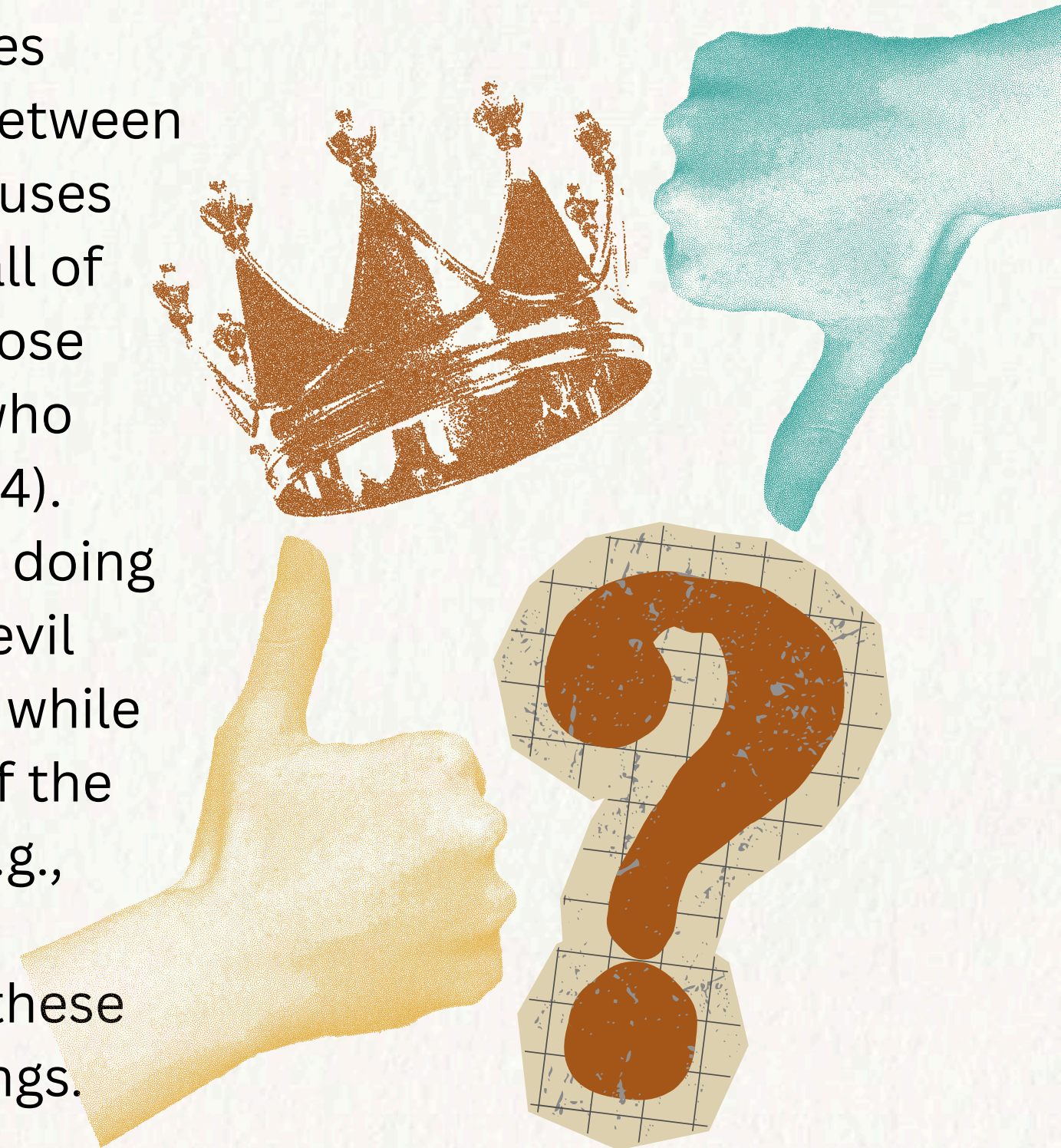

The Rise & Fall of Kings : as seen in the Book of Chronicles



Both the Book of Kings and the Book of Chronicles record the rise and fall of kings. The difference between the two books lies in the fact that Chronicles focuses more on the relationship between the rise and fall of kings. Chronicles emphasizes the message of "those who seek God receive His blessing, while those who forsake Him face His judgment." (2 Chronicles 7:14). Some kings in the Book of Kings are described as doing evil in the sight of the Lord, or even only having evil records (e.g., Rehoboam, Abijah, and Manasseh), while others are described as doing right in the sight of the Lord, or even nearly only having good records (e.g., Jehoshaphat and Josiah). However, Chronicles records the good deeds of these evil kings as well as the evil deeds of the good kings.





We have deliberately selected **eight kings**
from the Book of Chronicles
whose lives contained both good and evil,
sometimes seeking God
and sometimes abandoning Him.

We hope that we can learn spiritual lessons from them,
understanding that abandoning God
and doing evil leads to the path of downfall

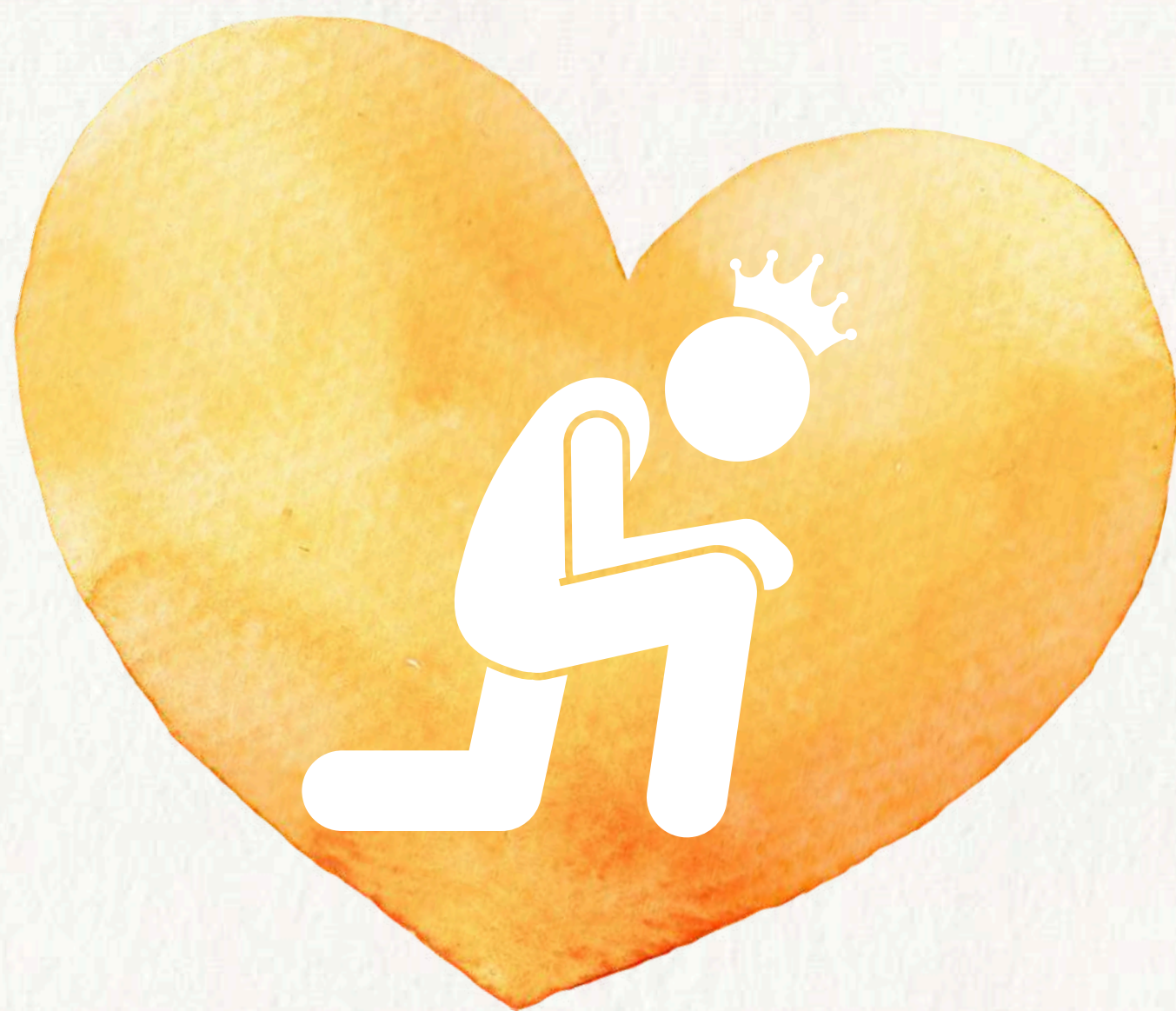

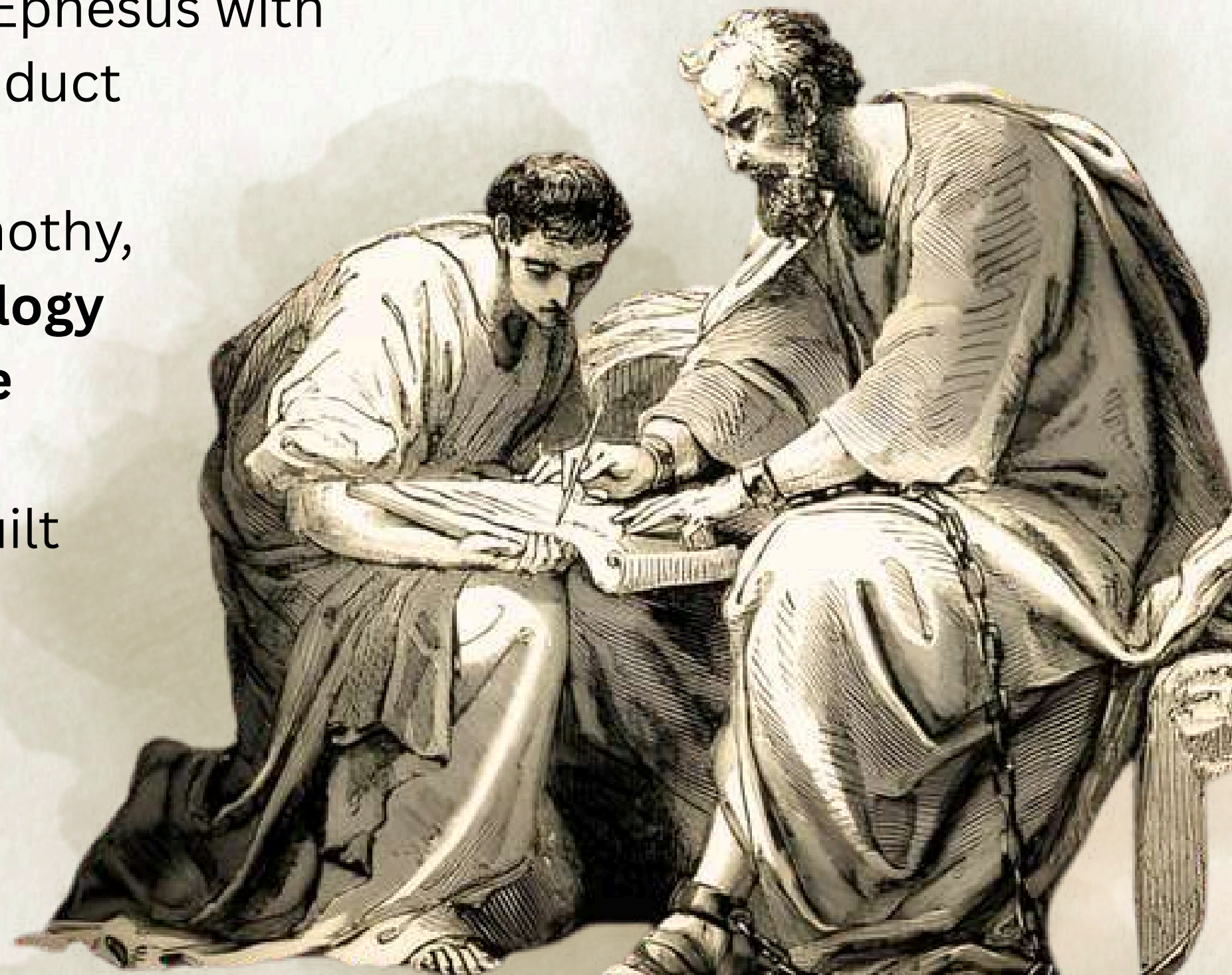


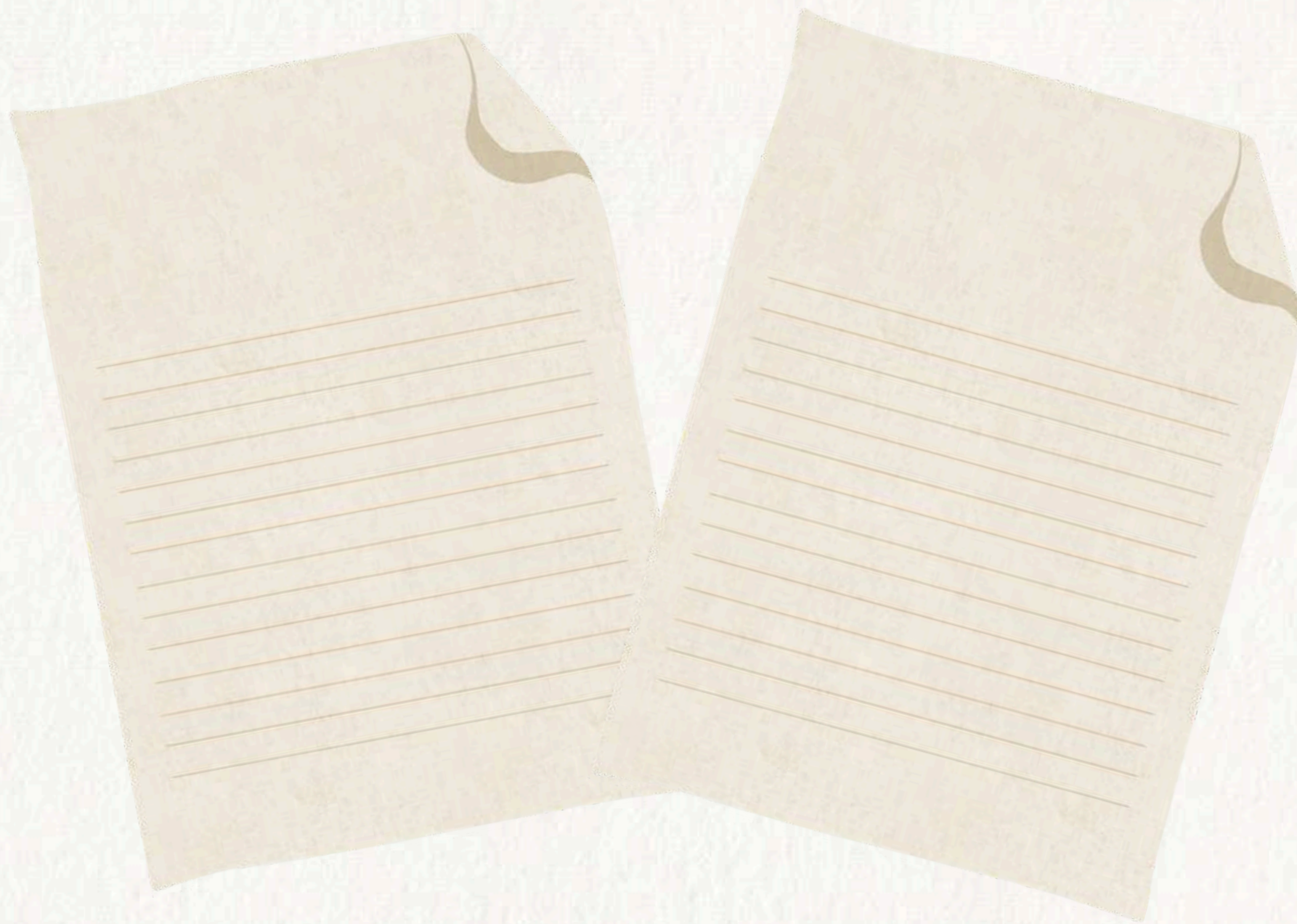
5. Leaving a Priceless Legacy

1 and 2 Timothy contain instructions to Timothy on how to lead the church of Ephesus with sound doctrine and godly conduct through firm faith.

In urging and encouraging Timothy, **Paul modelled the same theology faithfully in his own life to the very end.**

He showed that legacy was built through personal discipleship and mentoring and not just in words alone.
