Generations for Revival is the theme of our 75th Anniversary and this year's overarching focus. Bromley has embraced this vision and is intentionally putting it into practice at different levels within our congregation.

Since our launch in September 2024, we have actively sought to bring together people of different age groups to worship collectively and to live out Christ's mission. More than a year has passed, and we remain very much in a season of learning—"crossing the river by feeling the stones." Nevertheless, our deep hope is that our efforts will ensure that *Generations for Revival* becomes not merely a slogan, but a lived and practical direction.

Our Sunday service is one key platform where this vision is being embodied. We intentionally incorporate intergenerational elements, including the selection of hymns from different languages and eras. Children, youth, adults, and seniors are all encouraged to participate in various service roles. Since September last year, we have also held a joint sermon once a month, primarily on Communion Sundays. The Communion liturgy itself powerfully expresses unity across generations. While we have begun to see encouraging fruit, we also face inevitable challenges: seniors may be unfamiliar with English worship songs, children may struggle with Chinese lyrics, and young people may find the worship

atmosphere less engaging. Therefore, we continue to teach and remind one another that the focus of our worship is God Himself, while learning to practise mutual acceptance, patience, and understanding. This remains the direction in which we are striving. From my personal perspective, the church indeed needs intergenerational pastoral elements; however, not every aspect of church life must be intergenerational. It is equally important to provide appropriate spaces and platforms that nurture and meet the distinct needs of different age groups. God values every life and has created each person with unique qualities and needs.

For the 75th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service, each congregation was invited to present a tapestry. Everyone was encouraged to paint, and each individual contribution came together to form a beautiful and meaningful picture. Our young people were invited to represent the congregation by presenting this tapestry. ***"But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light."*** People of different generations all belong to the same community of the called.

May we continue to bear witness to the light of the Lord.
